

**EMERGENCY ORDER NO. 3 PURSUANT TO  
NEW YORK STATE EXECUTIVE LAW §24**

WHEREAS, the existing pandemic of coronavirus (COVID-19) has produced an unprecedented public health emergency within the unincorporated area of the Town of Cornwall; and

WHEREAS, on June 11, 2020, the Town Supervisor proclaimed a state of local emergency pursuant to New York State Executive Law §24; and

WHEREAS, Orange County is currently experiencing a "spike" in coronavirus cases such that it is necessary to temporarily suspend and modify parts of certain local laws, ordinances, order, rules and regulations in order to assist and aid in coping with the health disaster.

NOW, THEREFORE, by virtue of the powers vested in me as Supervisor of the Town of Cornwall and pursuant to Section 24 of the Executive Law of the State of New York, I hereby order and direct that:

1. Effective immediately the provisions of Town of Cornwall Code Chapter 111, "Peddling And Soliciting", Section 111-7, "Granting of license", are suspended, and no such licenses shall be granted except as provided herein.

2. Any party wishing to apply for a license under Town Code Chapter 111 during the duration of the state of emergency may petition the Town Board for an exception based upon a showing that the proposed peddling or door-to-door solicitation meets the Town Code's requirements and, further, does not pose any danger to public health. Such application shall be in writing and shall set forth in detail the grounds for seeking the exception. Applicants shall be required to provide such other and additional information as the Town Board may require, and in granting a permit the Town Board may impose reasonable conditions.

3. Pursuant to the provisions of New York State Executive Law Section 24, Subdivision 2, this order shall cease to be in effect five days after promulgation unless it appears to the Supervisor of the Town of Cornwall that the emergency conditions continue, in which case this Order may be extended for an additional five days.
